DO YOU BELIEVE IN ANGELS?

On September 15th, after worship and social time, we are going to begin a new Bible study entitled "Angels and Demons: The Lutheran Difference". Here is an excerpt from the study:

"You believe in angels? You've got to be kidding!" "The Bible teaches that there are angels . . . and demons." "So, you believe in harps, wings, pitchforks, and pointy tails?" "Well, not exactly." As Lutherans interact with other Christians, they often find themselves struggling to explain their beliefs and practices. Although many Lutherans have learned the "what" of the doctrines of the Church, they do not always have a full scriptural foundation to share the "why." When confronted with different doctrines, they cannot clearly state their faith, much less understand the differences. Because of insecurities about explaining particular doctrines or practices, some Lutherans may avoid opportunities to share what they have learned from Christ and His Word. The Lutheran Difference Bible study series will identify how Lutherans differ from other Christians and use the Bible to show why Lutherans differ. These studies will prepare Lutherans to share their faith and help non-Lutherans understand the Lutheran differences.

Angels are very real. The Bible makes that clear. Angels are also part of popular culture. Oftentimes, however, angels described in Scripture differ from the portrayal of angels in books, film, and art. Demons are also real and extremely popular in the culture. Once again, though, those pop culture portrayals also often differ from what God tells us in His

Word. What are angels? How do they serve God? What are popular misconceptions about angels? Who is Satan? Where did he come from? Who are the demons? Join us on Sunday, September 15th, as we begin a new study on "Angels and Demons". We will learn a lot and have a lot of fun learning. God bless everybody.


