


# December Special Mission: Lutheran Family Service



# Stewardship Section:

"We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves" (1 Thess. 5:12-13). Have you finished your Christmas shopping yet? Do you have a person or two on your list that you just don't know what to give them? While I know you are running short of ideas...dad doesn't really want another tie, and your kid's teacher doesn't need another coffee mug. It can be nothing short of maddening to try to figure things out in the middle of this busy season!

As stewards of all of life and life's resources, we know that life is more than giving gifts. We stewards never want to take anything the Lord provides for granted. During this season of Advent and Christmas, it is a great idea to do whatever you can to be a faithful steward of your pastor. Even more so than the rest of the year, the demands on their time, their presence and their stewardship of the Gospel in the congregation become heightened.

The demands on pastors can wear them down and wear them out. How does the steward in the congregation serve as a faithful steward of the treasure that is their pastor? Here are a few ideas:

- Put them at the top of your prayer list. Pray that the Lord guards them against the weariness that makes them susceptible to the work of the devil.
- Make worship a priority St. Paul admonishes the Thessalonians and us to respect those who labor among us. There is no greater way to steward your pastor than to respect him enough to show up and receive what he has been sent to offer in the proclamation of the Gospel and administration of the Holy Sacraments.
- Be receptive to his work If your pastor is tasked with calling you to repentance or encouraging you to be in worship, know that he is only caring for your soul.
- Esteem him highly Take the time to thank him for his faithful service to Christ, the congregation and your family.
- Be at peace This is an easy time for even minor annoyances to get blown out of proportion and become
  full-blown conflict. This not only spoils the season of Advent and Christmas, but it also spoils our
  stewardship of the Gospel and those who serve us in that Gospel. Remember that Jesus came into the
  world to be the Prince of Peace. This is an act of grace and mercy. The steward seeks to reflect this toward
  their pastor and their brothers and sisters in Christ.

Stewardship at Christmas can be a challenge. Stewardship of your pastor during this time of the year is critical to our shared stewardship of the Gospel at a time of year when many are more open to hear and receive it.





#### 2025 Voters' Meeting Minutes (November 2, 2025)

Emanuel Lutheran Church Voters held their annual meeting on Sunday, November 2 following the morning church service. Pastor Davis opened the meeting with prayer. There were 62 voters in attendance.

Dick Schwandt moved to approve the minutes from the 2024 voters meeting; Dan Wagner seconded. Motion carried.

Howard and Brandy gave the financial report. A question was raised on the discrepancy in the previous years voted on budget and the numbers that are being presented. Brandy explained that during the office transition, some accounting discrepancies were found. The office is moving forward and believes to have things on the right path.

#### Treasurer Report:

General: \$59,330.81 Dedicated: \$21,850.93 Reserve: \$20,124.36

Liquid CD: \$25,940.43

The parish report and membership reports were reviewed.

#### **Board Reports:**

**Elders:** The elders have been busy with the office transition after Lisa's passing. They continue to support Pastor and the confirmands with the BBQ cookout fundraiser. They met with Sunday School teachers and feel things are going in the right direction. They continue to gather for an annual retreat and book study.

**Evangelism:** Continuing to send milestone birthday and anniversary cards and support the Adopt a Grad program. Supported the church in serving at The Banquet in June. They hosted a New Member Sunday in June and plan to host one annually. They plan to go caroling December 7. They are working on a new church directory.

**Preschool:** Instituted October 1, 1979 and closed May 16, 2025. It was reported that the preschool in Brookings is very appreciative of the items we donated to their preschool.

**Stewardship:** The budget is done and special missions are on the ballot. They are working on envelopes for the upcoming year.

**Youth:** The youth group has been very active with an average of 12 youth attending events. They have attended devotionals, team building days, Easter Breakfast, Camping, Camp Minneboji, National Youth Gathering, and many more events.

**Cemetery:** The cemetery has an address now: 47797 140<sup>th</sup> St, Corona, SD 57227. They are working on installing the new sign. Brandy is working on putting information on the church website.

**Endowment:** No meetings were held in 2025. A question was asked on the purpose of the endowment. The original plan was to invest funds so we could call a second mission worker. Funds have grown from \$67000 to over \$92000.

**Trustees:** Boilers are in. The water fountain has been fixed. New dishwasher, water softener, and stainless-steel table installed. In the sanctuary, the ceiling fans have been replaced, light bulb changed, and smoke detectors installed. Many smaller projects were also reported. Looking ahead, possibly adding mini splits in the upstairs confirmation rooms. The hot water heat in the parsonage needs to have some work done.

#### **Old Business:**

Hearing devices: Those with hearing issues are encouraged to speak with Brandy or an elder so we can look into getting the right equipment.

Screens: Dewey Athey moved to look into the possibility of installing screens in the sanctuary; Doug Dexter seconded. Motion carried.

#### **New Business:**

**Election:** Doug Dexter moved to accept the ballot as amended with Misty Weyh joining the Board of Youth and Harlan Monson joining the Endowment Board; Eric Mueller seconded. Since there were no contested positions, an election was not needed. Motion carried.

#### **Special Missions:**

Please use the "Special Mission Offering" envelope or make mention on your form of payment that you wish to contribute to the special monthly mission. If you are giving offering through our direct pay option, you may choose to direct funds automatically to our monthly mission or any other category that is listed on the offering envelopes. Reach out to the church office for more information or to make changes to your automatic giving.

**Budgeted:** There are six months that have a set schedule and a budgeted giving goal of \$1,100 per year. These Budgeted Missions and giving goals are determined by the Board of Stewardship:

January – Main Street Living
April – Together In Mission
May – Lutheran Family Service
June – Main Street Living
October – Together In Mission
December – Lutheran Family Service

Non-Budgeted Special Missions, voted on by our congregation: The remaining six months are set by our congregation during the voters' meeting. The floor was opened for discussion on what special missions we should focus on this year. Max Athey moved to add Lutheran Heritage Foundation to February. Doug Dexter seconded. Motion carried. Diann Dauwen moved to leave special mission envelopes as they are and have the food pantry be designated for November. Kim Kolb seconded. Motion carried. Linnea moved to have Orphan Grain train be the mission for March; Dewey Athey seconded. Motion carried. Wayne Dragt moved to have Mercy Meals be the mission for September; Linnea Schwandt seconded. Geoff Street moved to have Native American Ministry be July; Kim Kolb seconded. Motion carried. Curt Berkner moved to have LCMS Disaster Response be the mission for August. John Weyh seconded. Motion carried.

The Special Mission Giving Goal was discussed and Kris Street moved to aim for \$1,000 each month as our giving goal. Darwin Wojahn seconded. Motion carried.

**2026 Budget:** After reviewing the Special Mission giving goal \$6,000 (\$1,000 per month) this information was added to the special mission giving income and expense section. Darwin Wojahn moved to approve the 2026 Budget. Josh Radil seconded. Motion carried.

#### **Volunteer Recruitment:**

- No Volunteers came forward to lead the Thanksgiving Community Meal for 2026.
- No Volunteers came forward to be on the list to deliver meals in May and October 2026.

John Weyh moved to adjourn the meeting. Dick Schwandt seconded. Motion carried.
